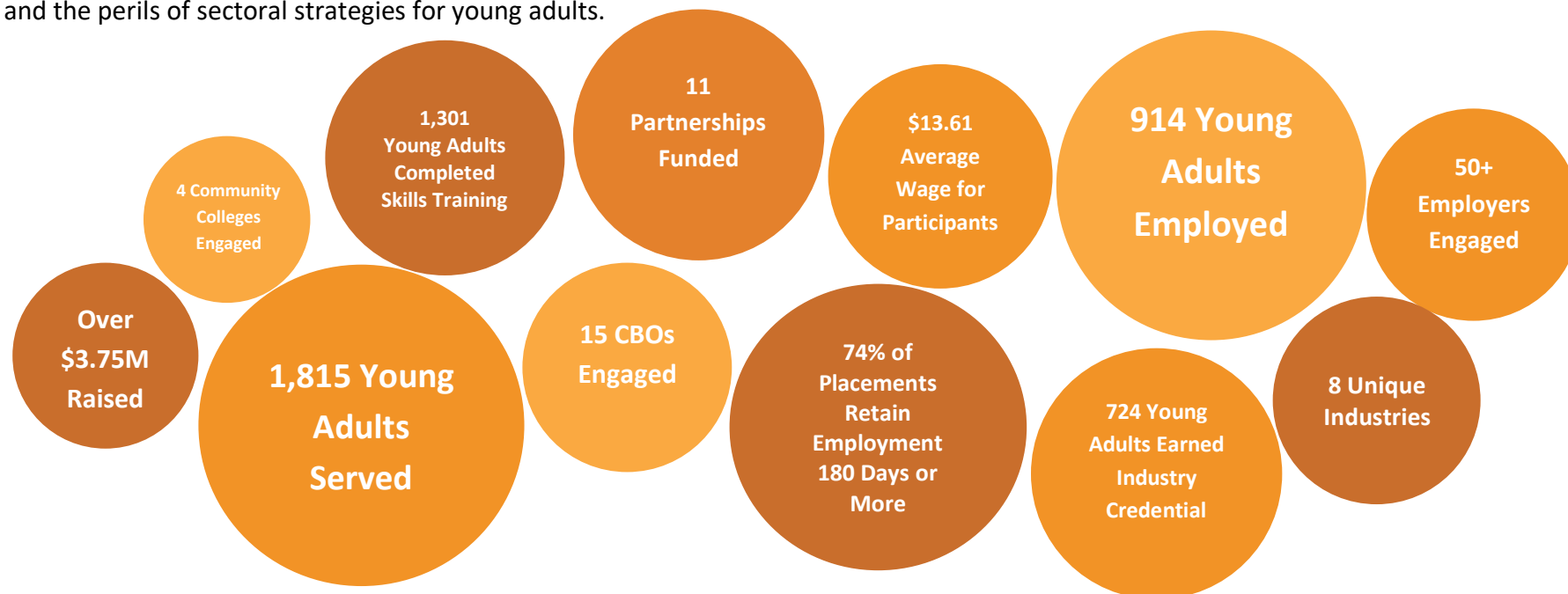


YOUNG ADULT SECTORAL EMPLOYMENT PROJECT (YASEP)

As part of our mission to improve the workforce development system in order to help young New Yorkers connect to stable jobs and career opportunities, JobsFirstNYC launched YASEP in 2013. YASEP represents an attempt to harness the power of sectoral employment strategies – programs that focus on filling the hiring needs of employers within one industry or set of occupations on behalf of out-of-school, out-of-work 18- to 24-year-old New Yorkers. With 11 partnerships funded over three years, YASEP has seen impressive results that illuminate both the promise and the perils of sectoral strategies for young adults.

Per Scholas, partnering with The Door to focus on expanding access to the Information Technology sector.



Phipps Neighborhoods Career Network partnering with Hostos Community College and Montefiore Medical Center for careers in the Allied Healthcare.



Queens Community House, partnering with Jacob A. Riis Neighborhood Settlement House, Sunnyside Community Services, and Ocean Bay Community Development Corporation to work together with employers in the food industry.
